Course Number and Course Name: NURS 4597W Senior Thesis in Nursing

Semesters Offered: All semesters

Number of Credits: 3 credits

Prerequisites: Students must have standing of junior or senior in the School of Nursing, and be enrolled in the Honors Program. At least three credits of ENGL 1010 or 1011 or 2011 or 3800.

Course Description: This course will demonstrate for students the relationship between the writing in the course and the content learning goals of the course. Students will learn how writing can ground, extend, deepen, and even enable their learning of the course material. In addition then to the general formal questions concerning strategies for developing ideas, clarity of organization, and effectiveness of expression, and the discipline specific format, evidentiary, and stylistic norms, this course will lead students to understand the relationship between their own thinking and writing in a way that will help them continue to develop both throughout their lives and careers after graduation.

These goals will be attained through critique and review of multiple drafts of the student's Honors thesis. Students will produce a revised thesis comprising at least 15 word-processed pages. Students must pass the W portion of the course to pass the course.

Course Objectives: Following completion of this course, students will be able to discuss and describe:

- 1. The relationship between writing and the attainment of learning goals in this course.
- 2. How writing can ground, extend, deepen, and even enable their learning of material.
- 3. The relationship between their own thinking and writing in a way that will help them continue to develop throughout their lives and careers after graduation.
