NUSC 3291- Nutritional Sciences Internship

3291. Nutritional Sciences Internship Variable (1-3) credits. Hours by arrangement. Prerequisite: NUSC 1165 and 2200. Open to juniors or higher; open to Nutritional Science majors with consent. May be repeated for credit up to a maximum of 6 credits. Students taking this course will be assigned a final grade of S (satisfactory) or U (unsatisfactory).

Provides an educational experience with nutritional professionals. Formal written report required.

<u>Objective</u>: To provide nutritional sciences students the opportunity to apply classroom concepts in an employment setting and develop skills necessary for entry into the workforce or post graduate educational programs.

Semester: Fall, Spring or Summer

<u>Hours Per Week</u>: Variable: 1 credit= 4 hours per week for 10 weeks or 40 hours per academic credit. Students may enroll up to 3 credits per internship, with a maximum of 6 credits.

Academic Qualifications:

Declared Major in Nutritional Sciences, at least 60 earned credits and a 2.7 total GPA. Completion of NUSC 1165 and 2200 with a B or better.

Grading: S/U

Components of Grading:

Student's journal/log: 20 points

Students will be required to keep a daily log of all hours and activities during the internship

Student's project: 30 points

Project will be assigned and graded by internship supervisor (example projects: developing nutrition educational materials, creating a healthy cookbook, designing menus for specific populations, assisting with a research project)

Final Paper: 30 points

The final paper will be submitted to the academic advisor and will include a summary of the project including pictures/handouts if applicable, log of hours in table form, a reflection of what the student learned, and evaluation of the experience by the student including what went well, what they would have done differently and advice for future students

Internship supervisor's evaluation of student: 20 points Evaluation forms will be emailed to internship supervisor

Students must earn at least 70 points to earn a satisfactory grade.

Desired Skills and Qualifications:

Microsoft office, social media, strong communication and organization skills. Ability to accept criticism and work independently.

Description of Intern Responsibilities:

Intern will be working with an onsite intern supervisor who they will report to regularly as well as a faculty advisor who is responsible for approving the internship and providing course credit.

Location:

Offsite. Car may be necessary.

Contracts:

A signed contract between the internship supervisor* and student that clearly outlines goals and learning objectives of the internship must be submitted to the department head for final approval.

*The Internship Supervisor must be a qualified nutritional professional with a minimum of a bachelor's degree in nutritional sciences or related field and at least 3 years of work experience in a nutrition related field. The supervisor must serve as a mentor for the student and provide continuous feedback to the student on their performance.
