To the University Community:

National surveys report that one in five women, and one in sixteen men, are sexually assaulted while in college. These appalling numbers are consistent across institutions, from small liberal arts colleges to large universities. As President, one of my highest priorities is the safety and welfare of all members of our University community, as well as ensuring that we are a respectful learning and working environment. We must do everything we can to combat sexual violence in our society – and our University.

To that end, I am proud to announce the launching of the <u>University's Sexual Violence</u> website. This informative site has been designed to help make every member of our community aware of what constitutes sexual assault, what resources are available in the event of an assault – and to give them information that can help prevent sexual violence from occurring.

The University of Connecticut enforces a zero-tolerance policy for sexual assault and all forms of sexual violence, and we work hard to minimize risks to our entire campus community. This commitment is reflected in the University's <u>Sexual Assault Response</u> <u>Policy</u>, which guides UConn's response to reports of sexual assault.
